Monday, June 29th
SS. Peter and Paul, apostles

From the earliest times, the apostles of Christ have been held in reverence. Saint Paul describes them as the foundation stones on which the Church is built, with Jesus as the capstone; and he considers himself the last and "least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle" (1st Corinthians 15:9). The emperor Constantine built two great churches in Rome to honour Peter and Paul: Saint Peter's Basilica and the great church of Saint Paul Outside the Walls.

In traditional icons, Peter and Paula are shown embracing, sharing the kiss of peace. Although they didn't always agree, they both worked tirelessly for Christ, bringing people from incredibly different backgrounds-Jews and Gentiles into one Church. The Entrance Antiphon expresses why these two apostles are so important to us. They were frail human beings, like us, but they conquered their weaknesses and fears and faced death with courage.

THE YEAR OF ST. PAUL concludes this weekend. In his address inaugurating the Pauline year, the Holy Father said, "We have come together not to reflect on a past history, irrevocably surpassed. Paul wants to speak with us today. That is why I wanted to convoke this special "Pauline year": to listen to him and to drink from him, as our teacher, in the faith and truth, in which are rooted the reasons for unity among the disciples of Christ."

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the Gospel we see that Jesus healed sick people by touching them. He touched people in various ways: with his words, with his hands, with his love. The Eucharist brings us very close to Jesus. And we too need his healing touch in our lives.

These miracles show that Jesus' saving power can overcome sickness and even death. The reading from Wisdom serves as a backdrop to this message. God did not create human beings in order to destroy them, but that they should enjoy a blessed immortality. Both the women with the hemorrhage and the daughter of Jairus were beyond the help of any earthly power. The great faith of the woman and Jairus is stressed. Both believed that Jesus possessed a supernatural power to heal. Both miracles are signs of God's power, restoring life and health through Jesus. The raising of the little girl is a foreshadowing of Jesus' gift of eternal life to all who believe in him.

The power to heal

Each of us is capable of doing some healing, because we have eyes that can see, ears that can hear, tongues that can speak, hands that can touch, and above all a heart that can love.
 Lord, make us instruments of your healing power.
 where there is hatred, let us sow love;
 where there is injury, pardon;
 where there is doubt, faith;
 where there is despair, hope;
 where there is darkness, light;
 And where there is sadness, joy. **Amen.**
