**Blankets for the Homeless:** A year round project to make blankets for the homeless.

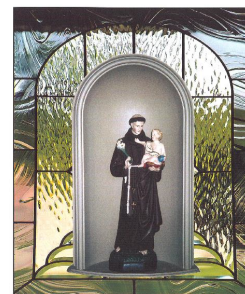
**Parish Prayer Tree:** Place those in need of prayer on the parish prayer tree. Call Peggy Cassidy at 252-0604

**Humanitarian Aid Relief for Haiti** – The diocese of Calgary is participating in the humanitarian aid relief for the earthquake victims in Haiti, launched by the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace. All donations received by CCOOP will be sent directly to its partners on the ground in Haiti, mainly Caritas Haiti. Donations, as usual, can be made as follows:

Cheques should be made payable to the parish but clearly earmarked **“D and P Emergency Haiti”** and placed in the collection basket or mailed to the parish office. Please ensure your personal details are clearly marked so that a tax receipt can be issued. There are some ‘Special Collection Envelopes’ available on the tables at the entrance to the church.

**The Federal Government will match the contributions** of individuals to eligible Canadian charitable organizations in support of humanitarian and recovery efforts in response to the earthquake, up to a total of \$50 million.



Beginning next weekend there will be a box at the entrance to the church to collect any old palms. These old palms are burnt to provide the ashes for Ash Wednesday.

## CHARITY:

In everyday life we as followers of Christ are to perform all our actions out of love of God, or in other words, all of our actions are to be permeated with Charity. Charity is the infused supernatural virtue by which we love God for Himself, and ourselves and our neighbours for the love of God. Its source is God, and thus, it is based on faith and God's revealed truths. St. Paul says, “...the charity of God is poured forth in our hearts by the Holy Spirit Who has been given to us.” (Rom 5:5). This virtue, being supernatural, is infused with sanctifying grace, and thus, a person who has lost the state of sanctifying grace also loses this virtue. As St. Paul says, “And if I deliver my body to be burned, yet do not have charity, it profits me nothing.” (1Cor 13:3). We can say that Charity lifts us beyond the limits of our human nature and enables us to be close to God and those things pertaining to Him.

Charity, being a friendship with God, is different than worldly friendships with people. Such friendships may be based on different ends, like usefulness, pleasure, ties of blood, nationality, or for goodness. But supernatural Charity has one end– God's goodness itself, loved for itself, and by which all other things are loved. On account of this, Charity is benevolent, that is, it is not self-seeking. It is also mutual. It is by Charity that we return the love which God has already shown us. And with this divine friendship we have something in common, namely, the sharing in the divine life, namely, sanctifying grace, and the expected future eternal happiness in heaven.

Thus, Charity is so important in life that we say it is the unifying force of all virtuous actions, and goes forth from loving God to loving our neighbours, as St. John writes, “In this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and do His commandments.” (1 Jn 5:2).
