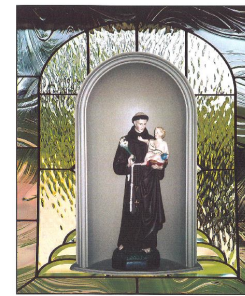

**PASTORS BLOG:** This month, we are forming a parish pastoral council (PPC) in St. Anthony's. It is one of the few bodies mandated by canon law to be formed in a parish (the other body is the parish finance council). The canon goes as follows: Can. 536 §1: If the diocesan bishop judges it opportune after he has heard the presbyteral council, a pastoral council is to be established in each parish, over which the pastor presides and in which the Christian faithful, together with those who share in pastoral care by virtue of their office in the parish, assist in fostering pastoral activity. §2: A pastoral council possesses a consultative vote only and is governed by norms established by the diocesan bishop. Many read the first part of the canon and think that a PPC is optional; in fact, it is not! Once the diocesan bishop “judges it opportune” (i.e. thinks that every parish should have one) the PPC is necessary. The reason the canon gives the bishop the option is that the pope wanted to give some flexibility to bishops in missionary countries.

There, forming a PPC could be difficult since many people are just coming to the faith and not ready to help in the pastoral leadership of the parish. Only the local bishop can know if the conditions are right. In case you're wondering, the bishop of Calgary has “judged it opportune” to have PPCs.

Next, it names all people that should be there: the pastor, anyone else exercising pastoral care with him (especially but not exclusively associate pastors), and the faithful who make up the PPC. Then, the PPC is given a basic definition: “to assist in fostering pastoral activity.” It is a very wide definition purposely. You see in §2 that the diocese can add some more norms, but we don't currently have any diocesan regulations in Calgary regarding the PPC. Basically, the freedom is left to parishes to further define and specify their exact role.

Lastly, the PPC is to have a consultative vote only. This is canon law terminology that says that the council can give advise to the pastor, but they cannot force him to do anything. Even though the pastor has the freedom to act against their wishes, it is often unwise unless he has very weighty reasons to the contrary.

So basically, the freedom is given to the people closest to the PPC itself to make decisions regarding it, and, most importantly, regarding the pastoral activity of the parish! As we start out, I get the sense that the parish is waiting to spring ahead. When the pews and carpet were finished, it's as though people were sighing, “Finally we are moving forward.” It was not just regarding the physical church but also regarding other areas of parish life as well. We can build community, strengthen our faith with education and prayer, reach out to our community (both those who are losing connection with the parish and those who need to be connected), and bring some dynamism to some of our current activities. The moving forward is a step we must make together, and I hope the PPC will make it possible.
