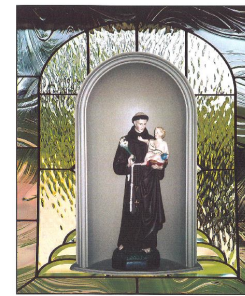

Father Eugene O'Reilly, C.Ss.R.

Affectionately known as "Red" Fr. O'Reilly was born in Monaghan, Ireland in 1944. he came to Canada with his family and later joined the Redemptorists. Upon graduating with a B.A. from the University of Windsor, he pursued his theological studies in France and Montreal and was ordained in 1972. Since 1983 he has preached Missions and retreats to Parishes, teachers, School Boards, Clergy and Religious throughout Canada and the U.S. He also served in St. John's, Newfoundland as Pastor of a large parish. He has been Vocation Director for the Redemptorists in the Eastern Province. Father Red completed a sabbatical year, part of which was spent at the School of Applied Theology, Berkeley, California. He has a particular interest in music, and has composed a number of religious songs. Some of his music is in the Catholic Book of Worship and the Grade four and five Religion Program in Canada. He has teamed up with other Redemptorists, and together they have produced four recordings. Mission Preaching is Fr. Red's full time ministry and he brings to it a ready smile, a wonderful sense of humour and a compassionate understanding of people and the complex world in which we live.

Pastor's Blog – March 2010

Catechumens have a special place in the Church. Catechumens are people who are not yet baptized, but who have been journeying in formation to be initiated in the Church and receive the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. Catechumens are different from Candidates who are people who are baptized already (Catholic or Non-Catholic), but still need formation in the faith. Catechumens are preparing for baptism during formation, while Candidates are reflecting on the grace of baptism moving in their lives during formation.

Because one of the effects of Baptism is incorporation into the Church, you cannot say that Catechumens belong to the Church, but they are joined in a special way (c. 206§1). The Holy Spirit, moving in their hearts, is preparing them to be baptized. Because of the Holy Spirit in their lives, they have a special connection to the Church to which Jesus gave the same Spirit.

This special connection gives them certain rights in the Church. For example, they have a right to a Christian funeral (c. 1183§1). God's mercy is superabundant. Those who are journeying to belong to the Church deserve to receive Christian burial because it is not their fault that time did not allow them to be baptized; time does not limit God, so they have a right to Christian burial. They can receive certain blessings that are usually reserved only for Catholics (c. 1170). In Alberta, for example, Catechumens have enrolled their children in the Catholic School system with a letter from their pastor attesting that they are indeed catechumens.

The Spirit moves as the Spirit will (cf. John 3:8), and because the Spirit is moving in such a deep and profound way in Catechumens, "the Church has a special care for catechumens" (c. 206§2). Much of missionary activity revolves around the catechumens: preparing them to be catechumens, preparing them to receive the Sacraments, and helping them after they have received. They have a special place in any parish, and even though we don't have any in St. Anthony's they need our prayers as we approach the Easter Vigil.
