Fifth Sunday of Lent

Scripture Note: The First Reading contains a message of hope addressed to the Jewish exiles in Babylon. There will be a new exodus, so glorious that it will put the great events of the first exodus in the shade. And all of this will happen because God is faithful to his people.

This prepares us for the Gospel. Christians see the radically new thing that God has done for us in and through Jesus. Specifically we see God's love and compassion in Jesus' treatment of a sinful woman. The story is taken from John, but it resembles the style of Luke. It's an 'entrapment' story which sought to show Jesus' wisdom in besting his adversaries.

The aim of the Scribes and Pharisees was to set a snare for Jesus. If he pardoned the woman, he could be accused of encouraging people to break the Law of Moses. If he agreed that she should be stoned, he would lose his name for mercy. But Jesus turned the tables on her accusers by suggesting that they look at their own sins.

Paul has willingly sacrificed everything for the justification that comes from faith in Christ, and for the hope of resurrection (Second Reading) Like a runner at the final stage of a race, he doesn't look back but keeps his eye on the winning tape.

*Justice is when you get what you deserve.
Mercy is when you don't get what you deserve.
And Grace is when you get more than you deserve.*

Development & Peace

The Special Collection today for Development & Peace is included in the Together In Action Campaign. By including this collection in TIA it is an effort to prevent the number of 'Special Collections' through out the year.

Today, the 5th Sunday in Lent, a collection is taken up for developing countries. Christians are urged to share their goods with others and thus express in a concrete way their desire to come closer to God and all God's children as a result of their Lenten efforts. The offering should reflect the money saved through penitential fasting and set aside for God's people.

With these last weeks of Lent passing by, and preparations beginning for the Holy Triduum, the last three days in Lent, it is a great time to consider the love Christ has for us– the love He shows us through His suffering and dying– a love which opens to us the gates of heaven.

We can come to a deeper appreciation of this great love by meditating upon the sufferings and death of our Saviour, as St. Alphonsus Liguori mentions in his book, The Passion and Death of Jesus Christ. The saint writes, "Our Saviour suffered so much in order that we should think of His sufferings; because if we think on them, it is impossible not to be inflamed with divine love."

He quotes many saints on the benefits of meditating on the Passion. For example, St. Bonaventure tells us, "One who desires to go on advancing from virtue to virtue, from grace to grace, should meditate continually on the Passion of Jesus." One day St. Thomas Aquinas asked St. Bonaventure what book he had drawn his lessons from, and the franciscan showed St. Thomas his crucifix, blackened by being kissed so much, and said, "This is the book whence I receive everything that I write; and it has taught me whatever little I know."

In this book on the Passion, St. Alphonsus reveals this great love our Lord has for us by presenting Our Lord's motives, acts, and sufferings in various chapters. The love He has for us by willing to make satisfaction for our sins; Why He suffered so much from the beginning of His earthly life to the end; The love He has for us in giving us His flesh and Blood as Eucharistic food; His love shown through the scourging and other sufferings, and finally His crucifixion; His last words from the cross, and the giving of His mother to us. In this way, with the help of many saints, anyone who reads passages from this book does not help but benefit from the holy wisdom and expressions of divine love that lie therein.

St. Alphonsus uses Sacred Scripture and the quotes from the saints.
