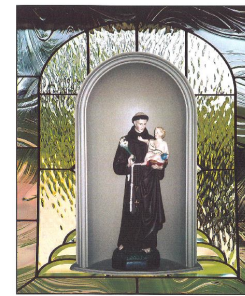

Second Sunday of Easter

April 11, 2010

Orientation:

Today is the eighth and last day of the octave of Easter, the Second Sunday of Easter, which now also bears the name of Divine Mercy Sunday. It has had many other names in history: Low Sunday to contrast with the great Easter Sunday; *Quasi Modo* Sunday from the first words of the entrance Antiphon; *Dominica in Albis*, Sunday in White or Whitsunday for the baptismal garments the neophytes wear for the last time.

The readings and prayer texts of the day emphasize peace, reconciliation, and the new creation.

Reflection:

Cease doubting and believe

While Jesus was alive Thomas was as strong as an oak.

But when Jesus was put to death, he became a reed shaking in the winds of doubt.

The truth was, though he didn't realize it at the time, that it was the Master who was the oak.

He was a mere sapling growing in his shade.

When the oak fell he was defenseless.

All of us are shaken by the winds of doubt.

We need to look at the Lord's wounds, and hear his gentle voice saying to us:

'Cease doubting and believe.'

Then with Thomas we shall make bold to say:

'My Lord and my God.'

TO LOOK WITH THE EYES OF FAITH – Fr. Ed Hospet

Invariably, there are Christians among us who want to be more than mere Sunday Mass-goers. We want to genuinely express our Christian identity in concrete commitment of one kind or the other, be it by striving to make a dynamic, spirit-filled parish, serving the needy through St. Anthony's Pantry, volunteering with Inn from the Cold, empowering the powerless, and fighting against injustice, etc. But perhaps on many occasions, we encounter failures and criticism of all kinds. Despite all our goodwill and dedicated efforts, our work does not bear fruit. Our situation becomes like that of the disciples in the Gospel of John 21: 1-14. They work all night, understandably make every effort possible but catch no fish. But things take a roundabout turn once the Risen Lord comes on the scene. Then the catch becomes so abundant that the disciples are not able to haul it in – we need to be cautious in interpreting the above Gospel passage. It can be interpreted to mean that once the Risen Lord comes into our life our efforts become a great success just as the disciples had a great catch. However, in doing this, we focus our attention on the abundant catch and miss the point. Our focus rather should be on the Risen Lord. The catch is secondary therefore we must look at our failures and disappointments not from the worldly perspective but from that of the Risen Lord. If we measure our efforts to proclaim Christ and His values in terms of worldly values of success and achievement, we would end up thinking and acting like the world and not like Christ. On the other hand, if we look at our efforts with the eyes of faith in the Risen Lord, then even in what the world consider as failure, we would see hope and meaning. Even though our catch would be nothing in the eyes of the world, the Risen Lord would make us realize the abundance of our catch. He would show us the right way of proceeding as He showed the disciples. What dedication to live a committed Christian life, leaving the result in the hands of God.
