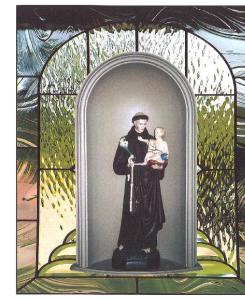
**Blankets for the Homeless:** A year round project to make blankets for the homeless.

The First [Old] Testament contains countless stories and passages providing modern readers with great beauty and comfort. But for every story that is beautiful there is another that is horrendous. For every verse that brings comfort, another disturbs and confuses. This confusion is understandable, given the centuries that separate our culture from that of the Israelite people of the First Testament.

*Israel's Story: Part One*, our bible study program beginning May 17<sup>th</sup>, guides readers through this world—from the creation stories in Genesis to the Israelites' captivity in Egypt, from King David to the prophets. By introducing us to the people and events of the First Testament, it leads us to a marvelous discovery: The God who was present and active in ancient Israel is the same God who continues to call us into a covenantal relationship.

## SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

MAY 9, 2010

### **Scripture Note:**

Many Gentiles had accepted Christianity as a result of the preaching of Paul and Barnabas. But then a question arose: how much of the Law and traditions of Moses should be required of these Gentile converts? The answer was: the bare minimum. They must abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood (symbol of life and which belonged to God), from meat of strangled animals (which still had blood in them), and from marriage within degrees of kindred forbidden to Jews though allowed in other traditions. And so, instead of becoming a Jewish sect, Christianity became a universal religion. The Gospel reading is taken from Jesus' discourse at the Last Supper, and is dominated by his imminent departure. He is concerned to assure his disciples that he will not leave them orphans. Despite his leaving, he and they will not be apart. If they keep his word they will be drawn into the love of the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit will remind them of his words. Peace is his final gift to them, a peace the world cannot give.

### *Reflection*

#### **Signposts on the footpath of peace**

To be glad of life, because it gives you a chance to love, to work, to play, and to look up at the stars.  
To despise nothing in the world except what is false and mean.

To fear nothing except what is cowardly.  
to be guided by what you admire and love, rather than by what you hate.

To envy nothing that is your neighbour's except his kindness of heart and gentleness of manner.

To think seldom of your enemies, often of your friends, and everyday of Christ.

And to spend as much time as you can, with body and with spirit, in God's out-of-doors.

These are little signposts on the footpath of peace.
