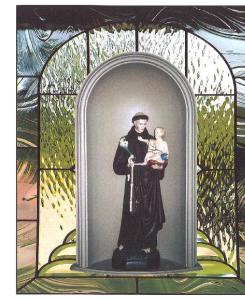
**Blankets for the Homeless:** A year round project to make blankets for the homeless.

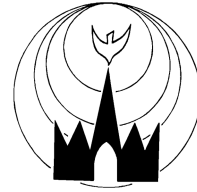

## THE FEAST OF PENTECOST

MAY 23, 2010



### Scripture Note:

Luke has the giving of the Spirit happening on the feast of Pentecost. Jewish tradition saw Pentecost as the feast of the giving of the Law on Mount Sinai. According to a legend a might wind turned to fire and voice proclaimed the Law. In a further refinement, the fire split into seventy tongues corresponding to the seventy nations of the world, to convey that the Law was proclaimed not only to Israel, but to all nations.

Luke exploits this tradition. He, too, has the mighty wind and tongues of fire coming upon the group of disciples. But for Luke the universal proclamation was not that of the Law, but of the Good News, a proclamation that has undone the sentence of Babel and re-united the scattered nations.

The Greek word for Pentecost (Pentekoste) means "fiftieth," and in early Christianity it referred to the entire Fifty Days of Easter.

The season after Pentecost resumes Ordinary Time, the longest season of the liturgical year, spanning three seasons of nature: late spring, summer and fall. Ordinary Time returns on the Monday after Pentecost, May 24, but only on weekdays, beginning with the Eighth Week of Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time Sundays resume on June 13, with the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time.

## The month of May – The month of Mary



For centuries the Church has devoted, in a special way, the month of May to the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is during this month, in springtime, that nature shows forth its beauty, with trees shooting forth

their buds, and tulips and plants starting to flower. And this is one of the reasons why, as St. Alphonsus says, this month was chosen. We can even recall one of her many titles which fit the season— she is the *Lily of the Fields*. Her virtue and sanctity shine forth amongst humanity just as a lily is so strikingly visible in a field. And why do we honour her and pray to her for help? It is because God chose her and set her aside as the human most worthy to bear His Divine Son for nine months, and to lovingly take care of Him in His childhood. Would not God the Father choose the most virtuous and holy woman on earth to become the Mother of His Son? And to make this possible, would He not plan, in His infinite love and wisdom, to create her soul pure, without the stain of original sin, and give her a plenitude of graces to help her avoid all sin during her whole life on earth? As Blessed John Duns Scotus tells us, "*Potuit, deuit, ergo fecit.*" God could do it, it is fitting, and therefore He did it. And it was at the foot of the Cross where we, represented by St. John, were given by Christ His mother as our own, to help us while we struggle here on earth. Thus, during this month, as St. Philip Neri urged, it is most fitting to perform extra devotions and works of mercy in her honour, out of love and thanksgiving for the help she has given us. One great book that has a marvelous set of devotions for this month is St. Alphonsus Liguori's book, "*The glories of Mary,*" which is available in print and also electronically from archive.org for free. Books such as this one help us to grow in our knowledge, understanding, and love for the Mother of our Saviour – our heavenly mother.
