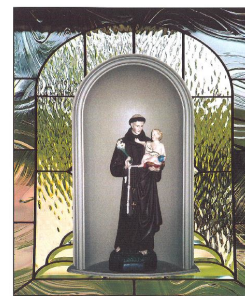
Blankets for the Homeless: A year round project to make blankets for the homeless.

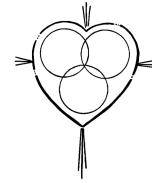
EUCHARISTIC ADORATION – PERPETUAL

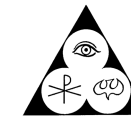

Orientation:

Today is the first of the three doctrinal feast celebrated after Pentecost, which commemorate not a person but a theological tenet, doctrine, or devotion of the Triune God, one God in three divine persons-Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

First Reading: The book of Proverbs, known for its collection of wise sayings, speaks today not of a distillation of human wisdom but a bold revelation concerning the wisdom of God. God's wisdom begotten before all ages. Eternal wisdom delights in the creation that he would be called to redeem un the fullness of time.

Second Reading: Paul announces to the Romans two causes for their boasting: faith and suffering. Christians boast of their faith, for they have received the gift of righteousness from God. Christians may boast of their suffering, for it leads us to continue to place all our hope in the gift of salvation communicated to us in the power of the Holy Spirit. All our boasting is in the Lord and what he has done for us.

Pastor's Blog - May 30, 2010

Just last week, I was on retreat with some of the other priests in the diocese. Retreats are wonderful opportunities to have deep prayer with God.

As a priest, I am required to make an annual retreat (cf. c. 276). Often times, we think of obligations as burdensome, but just the opposite in this case: an annual retreat is something that is very good – so good, that every priest must do it. Because it is good, it is something that all Christians should have the opportunity to do. We see it in our parish regularly: the secretaries will be taking a retreat day coming up in June. The parish pastoral council will have a retreat day this fall to know their call in service. Our parish mission was also a type of retreat. Couples preparing for marriage can use engage encounter to have a marriage retreat before this step in their lives. Married couples can use marriage encounter as a retreat to draw deeper into their marriage covenant. Many people take advantage of the retreats offered at the FCJ Centre and Mount St. Francis here in the diocese or Sanctum Retreat Centre in Caroline. These places offer a variety of retreats for men, women, overnight, day, or even week long ones.

Regardless of the format or length, the purpose is almost always the same: take some time to slow down, and pray with God. And the fruits are as diverse as the Spirit gives: peace, perspective, solace, insight, consolation, love, forgiveness, hope and so much more. For me, this last retreat was a chance to deepen my relationship with God. It is very easy to get caught up in daily tasks, that God slowly takes second place. My retreat was a chance to put God first again, and that makes everything else fit into place.
