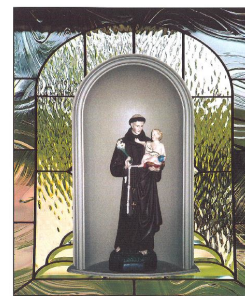
**Blankets for the Homeless:** A year round project to make blankets for the homeless.

**Ordinary Time:** After Pentecost we resume Ordinary Time, the longest season of the liturgical year, spanning three seasons of nature: late spring, summer, and fall. Ordinary Time returned on the Monday after Pentecost, May 24, beginning with the Eighth Week of Ordinary Time. It wasn't that obvious though, because the feasts of Trinity Sunday and the Body and Blood of Christ replaced the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Sundays. Normally, the Sunday vestments, cloths, and linens of this period will be green until Christ the King, November 21, with two exceptions. This Sunday we are celebrating the Feast of St. Anthony (with the permission of Bishop Henry), and the Assumption of Mary, August 15<sup>th</sup>. For both celebrations, the colour will be white.

We call this season Ordinary Time not because it is common or unexceptional, but because we are between the time of Easter and Advent. After all the celebrations of the Easter season, we have time to grow more deeply in our faith, as the color green in the vestments and on the altar remind us of this growth.

## The Feast of St. Anthony of Padua

### June 13, 2010

St. Anthony was born in the year 1195 A.D. in Lisbon, Portugal where his father was a captain in the Royal Army. Already at the age of fifteen years, he had entered the Congregation of Canons Regular of St.

Augustine and devoted himself with great earnestness both to study and to the practice of piety in the Monastery at Coimbra (Portugal).

After a time, St. Anthony, so moved by the example of the first martyred Franciscans, begged and petitioned his superiors to be given leave to join the Franciscan Order. In a quiet little Franciscan convent at Coimbra he received a friendly reception, and in the same year his earnest wish to be sent to the missions in Africa was fulfilled.

St. Anthony scarcely set foot on African soil when he was seized with a grievous illness. Even after recovering from it, he was so weary that, resigning himself to the will of God, he boarded a boat back to Portugal. Unexpectedly a storm came upon them and drove the ship to the east where it found refuge on the coast of Sicily. St. Anthony was greeted and given shelter by the Franciscans of that island, and thus came to be sent to Assisi, where the general chapter of the Order was held in May, 1221 A.D.

Since he still looked weak and sickly, and gave no evidence of his scholarship, no one paid any attention to the stranger until Father Gratian the Provincial of friars living in the region of Romagna (Italy), had compassion on him and sent him to the quiet little convent near Forli. For the occasion of a ceremony of ordination some of the hermits along with St. Anthony were sent to the town of Forli. Before the ceremony was to begin, however, it was announced that the priest who was to give the sermon had fallen sick. The local superior quickly asked the friars in attendance to volunteer. Each excused himself, saying that he was not prepared, until finally St. Anthony was asked to give it. When he too, excused himself in a most humble manner, his superior ordered him by virtue of the vow of obedience to give the sermon. St. Anthony began to speak in a very reserved manner; but soon holy animation seized him, and he spoke with such eloquence, learning and unction that everybody was amazed.

When St. Francis was informed of the event, he gave St. Anthony the mission to preach throughout Italy. At the request of the brethren, St. Anthony was later commissioned also to teach theology, "but in such a manner," St. Francis distinctly wrote, "that the spirit of prayer be not extinguished either in yourself or in the other brethren."

St. Anthony himself placed greater value in the salvation of souls than in learning. For that reason he never ceased to exercise his office as preacher despite his work of teaching.

In 1227 A.D. St. Anthony was elected Minister Provincial of the friars living in northern Italy. He breathed forth his soul on June 13, 1231 A.D.
