Blankets for the Homeless: A year round project to make blankets for the homeless.

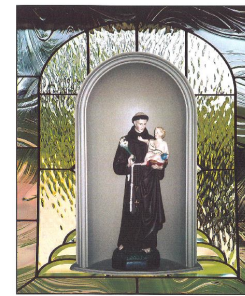
Parish Prayer Tree: Place those in need of prayer on the parish prayer tree. Call Peggy Cassidy at 252-0604

My priestly ministry totally, depends on your prayers. Please do continue to pray for me so that I may be a Holy Priest after the heart of Jesus, our Shepherd.
