Modesty

Fr. Hardon, S.J., in his *Modern Catholic Encyclopedia* defines modesty as "the virtue that moderates all the internal and external movements and appearance of a person according to his or her endowments, possessions, and station in life." This virtue includes modesty in dress and modesty in behaviour, and is regulated by humility and temperance. Humility helps modesty by curbing our inordinate desire for self greatness and helps one to know his or her position in relation to God and neighbour. Temperance helps to govern ones appetites and self control, and also effects, besides modesty, the virtues of chastity and abstinence.

Modesty in dress inclines a person to avoid not only what is offensive or tempting to others, but also whatever is not necessary. A good example of this virtue is when one is mindful of dressing for the occasion of wearing one's "Sunday's best" for attending the Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, while wearing a modest dress or shorts for going hiking, to the lake, golfing, etc.. As St. Augustine says, "In all your actions, let nothing be evident that would offend the eyes of another." *Modesty in bodily behaviour* helps a person to act appropriately according to the situation for example, of being mindful of the prayerful atmosphere in a church or chapel and conversing with others in a more suitable place; or being careful with ones words around a grieving family. By practising the virtue of modesty, we keep intact the bond of Charity towards our neighbours.
